The Village of Lombard, in conjunction with the Illinois Department of Transportation, will resurface Main Street in summer 2020. A public project open house is not occurring due to the Coronavirus pandemic, and project questions may be submitted through information on the project webpage. An excerpt of webpage information is located below for convenient reference.

- Where, when, and why is this improvement project occurring?
 - Main Street between St. Charles Road and Wilson Avenue is being resurfaced for needed maintenance. Pedestrian improvements are also included within the project. Notable project activity will commence in early May 2020 and will be substantially completed in early August 2020 to minimize effects on Glenbard East High School.
- Will residents, businesses, and motorists be impacted?
 - All improvement projects unavoidably involve some disruption, and the project team will attempt to minimize such inconvenience. Main Street will remain open to traffic, but alternate routes are encouraged. Driveways and side streets are anticipated to remain accessible.
- Will this improvement project proceed with the Coronavirus pandemic?
 - Since the project contract is administered by the State of Illinois, the Village must adhere to IDOT's policies relative to construction. At this time, IDOT has no plans to stop or suspend construction. The Village continues to review its programs to ensure that the health and safety of residents, employees, and businesses is the primary objective.
