Nominations can be submitted for a variety of preservation efforts. Projects will be judged according to their impact on the community, quality and degree of difficulty, and the degree to which they serve as an example of excellence in historic preservation and influence others. - Copies of any publications or newspaper clippings related to the nomination
- Photographs
- Research findings
- Biographies, etc
