Clothing, Shoes, Furniture and Appliances

Goodwill accepts these items in good condition provided they are no larger than a mini-fridge. Clean clothing in any condition is accepted since some is recycled for fibers. amazinggoodwill.com

Books, School Supplies, Vinyl Records, Musical Instruments and Like-New Art & Office Supplies

SCARCE collects these items at 800 S. Rohlwing Road in Addison for reuse by teachers and charities. Volunteers are also needed. scarce.org

Electronics

Goodwill's store at 351 E. Roosevelt Road accepts electronics in any condition during business hours for recycling, with exception of CRT televisions and monitors. Information on disposal of CRTs may be found at villageoflombard.org/electronicsrecycling.

Hardware, Building Materials and Tools

Drop off and also purchase these items at ReStore at 869 S. Rohlwing Avenue in Addison to benefit Habitat for Humanity. gohabitatrestore.com

Toiletries, Hand Sanitizer and Cleaning Supplies

PADS homeless shelters needs these items as well as others. Drop off 24/7 at 703 W. Liberty Drive in Wheaton. (630) 682-3846 dupagepads.org

Bicycles and Accessories

Used, repairable bicycles and accessories may be dropped off for charitable reuse through Working Bikes 501c3 at J&R Cycle, 240 W. St. Charles Road in Villa Park or at SCARCE at 800 S. Rohlwing Road in Addison. workingbikes.org

Eyeglasses, Hearing Aids and Keys

Eyeglasses, hearing aids & keys are collected in the Village Hall lobby for the Lions Club.

Scrap Metal

Iron, steel, and other metals are permissibly collected curbside by roaming scrappers prior to arrival of regular solid waste collection trucks.

Unused Medical Supplies and Equipment

Non-motorized wheelchairs, crutches, canes, and other supplies and equipment (but not commodes) in good condition may be dropped off at Project CURE, 10305 Argonne Drive in Woodridge. The list of acceptable items is listed at projectcure.org/chicago.

Cell Phones

Phones may be dropped off at the Second Chance Resale Shop at 222 E. Willow Avenue in Wheaton for Family Shelter Services. Phones are either programmed for 911 calling or recycled for revenue. (630) 221-8290 metrofamily.org

American Flags

Donate American Flags to the VFW via a mailbox in front of the Village Hall at 255 E. Wilson Avenue.

Car/Marine/Sump Pump Batteries

Many automotive centers accept the lead cell batteries for recycling but call first.

Foam #6 (Styrofoam)

This is **not** acceptable in curbside recycling, but Dart Container accepts dropped-off **#6 stamped**, clean foam of any color, **not** including packing peanuts or insulation. Their site is open 24/7 at 310 Evergreen Drive in North Aurora. dartcontainer.com
